1. Call to order and Introductions.

The 59th Annual General Meeting of the Burnaby Minor Hockey Association was called to order by President Cheryl Reesor at 7:11 pm. She expressed a welcome to those members in attendance at the meeting and provided an Indigenous land acknowledgement. The President advised the meeting where various resources, such as the BMHA Bylaws, Annual General Meeting Reports and Financial documents could be accessed. She also noted that members were welcome to ask questions during the meeting if done so in a respectful manner.

The President provided the meeting with an overview of the BMHA awards given during the 2022/23 season along with the list of "Graduating U18 Ring" recipients. She expressed congratulations to all.

The President reviewed the Agenda for the meeting and asked the Registrar for confirmation of quorum for the meeting. The Registrar advised that sixty members had registered for the meeting and that there were forty members now in attendance. The meeting has met the quorum requirements as outlined in the BMHA Bylaws. The President also confirmed that required notice of the Annual General Meeting had been provided to the Membership.

The President introduced the BMHA Life Members, Executive Committee members and BMHA Support Staff who were in attendance for the meeting. She noted that the Vice-President Programs, Joe Rocchetta, and Director of Coaching & Development, Jon Tagulao, were not able to attend the meeting and have provided their regrets. President Reesor advised that Executive Administrator Larry Hayes would be acting as Recording Secretary for the AGM.

President Reesor noted the passing of former BMHA members and supporters over the previous season and asked for a Moment of Silence in their memory:

JOSEPH, Laurie – passed away on June 9, 2022 at the age of 81. A long-time volunteer and former President of the Burnaby Winter Club MHA and supporter of both the Burnaby Winter Club and Burnaby MHA in the 1970's and 1980's. Father to former players Mike (BWC and BMHA) and Chris (BWC and NHL). Laurie was a strongly opinionated minor hockey volunteer who wanted nothing but the best for our game.

HANSON, Jeff – passed away on June 15, 2022 at the age of 42. A former playing member of the Burnaby Minor Hockey Association and accomplished amateur and professional lacrosse player.

LIVERSIDGE, Bill – passed away on June 26, 2022 at the age of 86 A long-time supporter of amateur hockey in the various parts of the Lower Mainland, especially with his sons at both the Burnaby Winter Club and the Burnaby Minor Hockey Association in the 1980's.

FIELD, Alfred – passed away on November 10, 2022 at the age of 74. A former volunteer with the Burnaby Minor Hockey Association in the 1990's at the team and Executive levels. He served as Burnaby MHA President during the 1995/96 season. Alfred is survived by his wife Lynn, son Andrew, family and friends.

MACIEJEWSKI, **Sheila** – passed away on November 21, 2022 at the age of 92. Along with her family, she was a long-time volunteer and supporter of the Burnaby Minor Hockey Association throughout the 1970's.

YAMANOUCHI, Sam – passed away on February 23, 2023 at the age of 86. A long-time volunteer and supported of the Burnaby Minor Hockey Association.

COLBOURNE, Bill – passed away on March 6, 2023 at the age of 90. Bill was a founding member and on the first Executive Committee, as Referee-in-Chief, of the Burnaby Minor Hockey Association in 1964. He held a number of terms as Burnaby MHA President, as well as being involved in coaching some of the organizations premiere teams. In addition to his efforts with the BMHA, Bill was a Division Manager with the Pacific Coast Amateur Hockey Association in the early 1970's. He then joined the BC Amateur Hockey Association (BC Hockey) Executive Committee as Junior "A" Director from 1974-1977. In 1977 he became 2nd Vice-President and went up the chairs - 2nd Vice-President (1977-1979), 1st Vice-President (1979-1981), and President (1981-1984). His term as President was an unprecedented period in the Province, with the three top BCAHA officers being from the Lower Mainland (Bill Colbourne, George Wong, and Bruce Allison). Bill's last involvement in amateur hockey administration was as President of the West Coast Junior "B" Hockey League (now the PJHL) and then with the Junior "B" Grandview Steelers in a management capacity in the late 1980's. Bill continued to be an enthusiastic supporter of the Burnaby MHA ... and the Montreal Canadiens! He has been recognized as an Honourary Life Member of the Burnaby MHA and was inducted into the Builder category of the Burnaby Sports Hall of Fame in 2004.

IAMEO, **Lorenzo** – passed away on April 14, 2023 at the age of 53. Lorenzo was a dedicated volunteer and supporter with the Burnaby MHA.

- e. Treasurer Report/Financial Report: As submitted and reviewed. The Treasurer requested that the financial statements and budget (Agenda item # 5) be included in his report. There were no objections. The Treasurer reviewed highlights of the Financial Report. The Treasurer provided a brief review and comment on the 2023/24 budget.

The Treasurer presented the following Motions:

Motion: Move that Vanderluit and Associates Inc. Chartered Accountants be retained to conduct the Review Engagement for the BMHA Financial Year End 2023. M/S/C

Motion: Move to receive the BMHA Financial Report and 2023/24 BMHA Budget as presented. **M/S/C**

The Treasurer invited members to contact him with any questions.

- f. Director of "C" Hockey Report As submitted and presented. No comments.
- g. Director of "A" Hockey Report As submitted and presented. No comments.
- h. Director of Female Hockey Report As submitted and presented. The Director of Female Hockey briefly commented about her report. She advised that the past season was very successful.
- i. Director of Coaching & Development Report The Director of Coaching & Development was not present at the meeting. His report was presented as submitted. No comments.
 - j. Director of BMHA Growth Report As submitted and presented. No comments.

5. Financial Report.

The Financial Report was covered in Agenda Item 4 (f) – Treasurer Report.

6. Committee Reports.

The Committee Reports were submitted and presented. President Cheryl Reesor asked the meeting whether there were any questions pertaining to any of the Committee/Support Staff Reports. There were no questions from the Floor.

Motion: Move to receive the Committee Reports, specifically the reports from the Executive Administrator, Registrar, Brand & Communications Support, Referee-In-Chief and Ice Allocator as submitted. **M/S/C**

7. Election of Officers.

The Executive Administrator outlined the process for the Election of Officers. Mr. Hayes reminded the meeting that the BMHA Bylaws did not allow nominations from the floor and that the individuals who had put their names forward as outlined in the BMHA Bylaws would be the only ones considered for election. He noted that if only one nomination was received for a position up to one week prior to the start of the Annual General Meeting, then the position will be acclaimed. The process for the Election of Officers was assumed by the President.

a. Treasurer.

The name of Rob Pritchard was put forward by the Nominating Committee for the position of Treasurer. No further nominations have been received. The President asks Mr. Pritchard if he is willing to stand for election and he answers in the affirmative. The President announces that Rob Pritchard has been elected to the position of Treasurer by acclimation for a two-year term beginning with the 2023/24 season.

b. Director of "C" Hockey.

The name of Keith Renfrey was put forward by the Nominating Committee for the position of Director of "C" Hockey. No further nominations have been received. The President asks Mr. Renfrey if he is willing to stand for election and he answers in the affirmative. The President announces that Keith Renfrey has been elected to the position of Director of "C" Hockey by acclimation for a two-year term beginning with the 2023/24 season.

c. Director of "A" Hockey.

The name of Wendy Godfrey was put forward by the Nominating Committee for the position of Director of "A" Hockey. No further nominations have been received. The President asks Ms. Godfrey if she is willing to stand for election and she answers in the affirmative. The President announces that Wendy Godfrey has been elected to the position of Director of "A" Hockey by acclimation for a two-year term beginning with the 2023/24 season.

d. Director of Female Hockey.

The name of Katie Larson was put forward by the Nominating Committee for the position of Director of Female Hockey. No further nominations have been received. The President asks Ms. Larson if she is willing to stand for election and she answers in the affirmative. The President announces that Katie Larson has been elected to the position of Director of Female Hockey by acclimation for a two-year term beginning with the 2023/24 season.

e. Director of Coaching & Development.

The name of Phil Gibson was put forward by the Nominating Committee for the position of Director of Coaching & Development. No further nominations have been received. The President asks Mr. Gibson if he is willing to stand for election and he answers in the affirmative. The President announces that Phil Gibson has been elected to the position of Director of Coaching & Development by acclimation for a two-year term beginning with the 2023/24 season.

f. Director of Volunteers

The name of Lindsay Marchioro was put forward by the Nominating Committee for the position of Director of Volunteers. No further nominations have been received. The President asks Ms. Marchioro if she is willing to stand for election and she answers in the affirmative. The President announces that Lindsay Marchioro has been elected to the position of Director of Volunteers by acclimation for a one-year term beginning with the 2023/24 season.

On behalf of the Burnaby Minor Hockey Association, the President thanked the outgoing 2022/23 BMHA Executive Committee members for their service over the previous season.

8. New Business.

The President introduced the Special Resolutions that would be voted on at the meeting:

Revision of BMHA Constitution and Bylaws

RESOLVED AS SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS that:

Resolution #1 - Part 14 - COMPLAINTS, DISCIPLINE AND

APPEALS - 14.3 - President to provide report to the Executive.

Change the current wording to:

If a complaint cannot be resolved informally by the President with the complainant and the alleged offender, the President will bring the complaint forward for review at the next scheduled meeting of the Executive. If the complaint raises issues that are, in the President's view, time sensitive and/or cannot wait to be addressed at the next scheduled Executive meeting, the President has the discretion to immediately refer the complaint to the Discipline Committee. A designate appointed by the President may be utilized at any point in this process.

Rationale: The change aligns with the complaint process with other related procedures permitting a designate to be appointed by the President. This will allow for a more efficient and timely process in dealing with complaint issues.

The President provided comment on the proposed procedural change. An electronic vote on the proposed resolution change was conducted and the results were 96% In Favour and 6% Against. The Resolution has passed.

Resolution #2 - HOUSEKEEPING

The Directors of the Society, or designate, be given the authority to make miscellaneous changes to the Bylaws in order to correct any errors in grammar, punctuation, page numbering, Bylaw numbering, in the Table of Contents, gender reference and to correct any errors in context and position references which may have been inadvertently overlooked."

An electronic vote on the proposed resolution was conducted and the results were 97% In Favour and 3% Against. The Resolution has passed.

The President thanked the Membership for approving the Resolutions.

New Business from the Floor.

The President invited Members to ask provide comment or ask any questions of the BMHA Executive.

Question – From the parent of a Female goaltender. The comment was made that there is a need for more goaltender development. The President advised that there is a priority to provide more goaltender development. The parent noted that they were quite pleased with the quality of goaltender development that was being provided through Pro-Formance Goalie School. The President noted that the new Director of Coaching & Development would be working on this issue. Comment was made that the goaltender training time of fifty minutes was not long enough and should be a minimum of one hour in length. The President advised that the ice time being utilized at Burnaby Canlan Scotia Barn is very expensive and that limitation exist. The Ice Allocator reported that Scoti Barn normally only provides ice sessions in fifty-minute time slots but that she has made enquiries with them. There have also been ice clean issues identified with the shorter ten minutes time being provided. This change has not worked well and has resulted in some shorter ice sessions. The President noted that there are different game length requirements between Female Hockey and Integrated Hockey and that she is working on trying to make things more equitable. She advised that there is a focus on making ice allocation as fair as possible.

A concern was raised regarding the ice that was being provided to the U11 C2 Bulldogs this past season. There is a 1-hour game time and 1-hour practice time being provided, but many visiting teams are receiving 1.5 hours from their Associations. The President explained that the shortage of ice has resulted in the BMHA often assigning ice to the minimum required by PCAHA rules. The high cost of ice at Scotia Barn has made longer game times difficult to provide.

A question was raised regarding a situation where a BMHA team Manager has allegedly stolen funds from the team. The President outlined the difficulty with this matter and of some steps that have been taken to resolve it. It was noted that the BMHA Executive is very limited in the actions that can be taken as the money was a part of the team account. The President noted that the new process for distribution of referee fees could help with the collection of money at the team level.

A question was asked about the training that is being provided to BMHA on-ice officials. It is felt that the young officials need more mentorship. The President agreed with this comment. She noted that a program is being put in place by the BMHA Referee-in-Chief, including his attendance at games to evaluate officials.

A question was asked regarding the process of reimbursing coaches for coaching clinics. There is concern that some reimbursements seen to be taking a very long time to process. The President reviewed the new on-line reimbursement procedure, with the goal of trying to better "streamline" this system. Any unusual situations can be sent to her for further investigation.

A comment was made about the need to try and attract female players from New Westminster. It was noted that some organizations have implemented lower player registration fee structures to help recruit and retain female players. The President noted that the New Westminster MHA is a much smaller organization with lower costs. She also felt that a number of their teams do not incorporate referee fees into their player registration fee structure, thus lowering the player registration fee costs. The Director of Female Hockey noted that there is some additional marketing being done to specifically target New Westminster female players.

A comment was made regarding a perceived increase in dangerous hits to the head and that these are not being taken seriously enough. This also includes the Female Hockey program. The President acknowledged the concern and advised that this is an issue that BC Hockey needs to focus on.

A request was made that more coach development needs to be done with BMHA teams, both on and off ice. It was felt that the BMHA could provide coaches with some resources, including coaching kits, to assist new coaches The President noted that this could be considered, with some of the basic costs being covered by the BMHA. The supply of coaches "white boards" and small pylons would also assist. It was suggested that a "loaner program" be established to better make coaching resources available. It was felt that some of the new BMHA coaches do now have even basic coaching supplies when they join the organization. The President reported that this is something that is being evaluated and will be a part of the Player and Coach Development duties.

The President provided the meeting with a brief overview of ice arena availability in the City of Burnaby. She noted that Rink "B" at the Rosemary Brown Arena is scheduled to open on a "bard bones" basis on August 28/23. The projected opening date for Rink "A" has not yet been established. The planned demolition of Burnaby Lake Rink has been delayed and that the building will be open until the end of December 2023. With that, the 2023/24 season should start with three City of Burnaby ice surfaces available.

There were no further comments or questions from the meeting.

The President thanked all for their efforts during the previous season and for attending the Annual General Meeting. She particularly thanked Jon Tagulao for his work, along with our facility partners. Special thank you as well to the Government of British Columbia and the Community Gaming Branch for their continued support of the BMHA through the annual Community Gaming Grant. As well, a thank you to the BMHA Executive Committee.



BMHA DIRECTOR REPORTS

President's AGM Report for Season 2023/2024

Burnaby Minor has now grown to 918 players and over 56 teams. With all the growth in our association and the Ice challenges we faced this year, we had so much success to be proud of.

Our Bulldogs C teams won 8 banners across 7 teams. The Bulldogs A teams won 4 banners across 4 teams. Our Wildcats C teams won 7 banners across 4 teams.

Of course, the biggest win was that we had 918 kids on the ice, having fun, being social in person, making friends and creating memories that will last a lifetime. In order to deliver 6 months of on-ice hockey, we have well over 350 volunteers. We are grateful for all BMHA's volunteers who put in countless hours. I'd like to thank all our coaches, managers, and team safety officials for all the work they do daily for our kids.

In the 2022-2023 season we faced Goalie shortages. As a result, we created BMHA's Goalie Strategy which included the Goalie Reimbursement Policy for the 2023-2024 season.

This season we faced ice shortages. By early December it was apparent that there was inequity in ice allocation and so the Ice Allocation Committee was formed. This committee located additional ice at BWC, Moody Park in New Westminster, and Planet Ice Coquitlam. The ice inequity persisted through the end of the season. BMHA was also notified by the City of Burnaby of 2 complaints that were sent directly to the city in 2023. As a result, as President I conducted an internal ice audit. The full season's ice usage reports are attached and, in the link, below containing raw data downloaded directly from TeamSnap. Summary sheets by program and age divisions are also attached. The high-level summary **in minutes** of ice are as follows:

Please see below the link for files and raw data files from Team Snap along with summary sheets indentifying pratice ice, game ice, development ice, shared ice, bought ice etc where applicable. While I completed this work as the President, I recommend that the new Board of Directors source an armslength/independent party to complete an ice audit for BMHA and review these files for errors or ommissions. Sharing these files prioritized transparency over potential critique.

BMHA TeamSnap Schedule Summaries and Export Raw Data

The "BMHA Ice Allocation Policy" was drafted and proposed to the Board of Directors, and the Board approved this new policy. The policy can be found on BMHA's website **BMHA Ice Allocation Policy**. One of the Policy outcomes is the requirement to post BMHA's actual Ice Allocation to BMHA's website for full transparency of ice usage at BMHA. This work is now complete. Members will be able to find BMHA's full ongoing ice schedule for teams on our website throughout the season. This was tested with the Spring Pond Hockey and Development that took place in April and May, at the new arenas at the Rosemary Brown Recreation; **Ice Info.** Ice equity and allocation will require further work by the new Board of Directors.

The "BMHA Development Committee" was also formed again this season.

Integrated Development: Integrated Development took place on additional BMHA ice dedicated for use by the Integrated Development Providers on Saturday afternoons. Historically, U5 received development all season, U7 received development to the end of November and U9 to the end of October. This year, U5, 7 and 9 received development on Saturday afternoons for the full season. In the fall there were a few sheets of the Saturday Development Ice that went to U11A and U13 A teams. Integrated U11C and U13 C players eventually received a few sessions in February. Ice availability and timing have been identified as key issues when it comes to delivering and getting players to participate in U11 and U13 development. Weekday morning city ice was returned unused this past season and is also available at non-city arenas at a lower cost. The board therefore decided that U11 and U13 development will be delivered on weekday mornings from September to December. To ensure BMHA can find ice and confirm family's appetite for this development, the board made U11 and U13 Development a part of the player registration process at a low

cost of \$150 and will be held weekday mornings from September to December. Early registration levels indicate this will be effective in ensuring development is delivered for U11/13 this coming season.

Female Development: Female Development took place on Wildcat practice ice and Wildcats did not receive any dedicated development ice from BMHA for use by Wildcat Development Providers. Weekday morning city ice was returned unused this past season and is also available at non-city arenas at a lower cost. To ensure BMHA can find dedicated development ice for Wildcats and confirm family's appetite for this development, the board made U11 and U13 Development a part of the player registration process at a low cost of \$150 and will be held weekday mornings from September to December. Early registration levels indicate this will be effective in delivering development U11/13 Wildcats this coming season.

The board approved an increase in the coming season's Development budget to \$120,000 for BMHA total development in the 2024-2025 season. In the past the contract for oversight of A hockey tryouts was intermingled with development contracts. BMHA published 5 "Request For Proposal (RFPs)" for U5, U7, U9, U11 and U13 Development on its own. Further RFPs to be published for A tryout oversight contracts. BMHA received several great submissions. The committee met and reviewed all submissions. The committee also interviewed qualified candidates. Even though work began in January, decisions have been delayed and the new Board of Directors will make the final decisions. Decisions about, and oversight of development, will require continued attention by the Board of Directors.

Other Committees formed include: BMHA Contract Committee (work completed), BMHA Volunteer Committee (work tabled for next season), BMHA Policy Committee (work completed), BMHA Awards Committee (work completed), BMHA Complaint Committee (2 complaints remain outstanding).

2023-2024 Area of Responsibility - Risk Manager

Although there were challenges such as reduced ice availability due to the loss of Kensington and Rose Mary Brown being late, plus a couple of winter storms that forced the cancellation of games due to travel advisories, we were able to successfully complete another season.

Big thanks to all the volunteers who stepped up and enabled us to deliver another great year of minor hockey to our members. Also, we appreciate all the support and understanding from the members and families during this difficult time and looking forward to seeing everyone at the rink next season.

Please see below for a summary of this year's activities.

Criminal Record Checks (CRC)

With the implementation of BC Service Card linkage to the online CRC application process, the clearance letters are be processed more quickly than before by the ministry of Public Safety. Working with our registrar, program directors and division managers, we have been able to streamline the onboarding process for volunteers and minimize the issues with CRCs this season. Where there were issues, we worked with the Ministry to resolve them.

Updated Hockey Canada Dressing Room Policy

This season, Hockey Canada released an updated dressing room policy that is currently being reviewed by our parent organizations (BC Hockey/PCAHA) and BMHA will be updated our policies to reflect this once they are available.

Sportsmanship Starts in the Stands

The association was able to complete the BC Hockey certification for this season early as the programs and division managers where able to confirm that their teams have completed the requirements ahead of the due date.

Reimbursement for HCSP and RIS Courses Fees

As part of our commitment to improving the volunteer experience, the online process to handle reimbursement for Hockey Canada Safety and Respect in Sports course fees to our volunteers has completed its 2nd year. The process has reduced the wait-time to within 6 weeks. Appreciate the support of our treasurer and bookkeeper to keep it running smoothly.

PCAHA Team Official Certifications

To minimize the disruption to the teams, we started the process of validating the team officials' certifications and other requirements as we rostered them onto the teams. Working with our registrar and division managers we worked the impacted team officials to resolve their issues. Ultimately, the number of team officials de-rostered in January was much less than before. Looking forward, we hope to improve the process and further reduce this.

Buddy Check for Jesse (BCFJ)

This season, our association was proud to partner with BCFJ to raise awareness for mental health. Targeted information and event swag were distributed to our teams with the message of compassion and understanding for those struggling with mental health. In appreciation of their help and swag, BMHA made a donation on behalf of our members to the BCFJ to continue their good work.

U11/U13 Goaltender Development Fee Reimbursement

During this off-season, we are developing the process the collect the information required to issue the reimbursement cheques to the U11/U13 goaltender families for their development fees for last season.

BMHA Treasurer's AGM Report - 19 June 2024

The Budget for the Fiscal Year Ending March 31, 2025 as approved by the BMHA Executive is attached. The In House Financial Statements for the FYE 2024 are also attached.

For the Fiscal Year Ending March 31, 2024 (FYE 2024) BMHA had a balanced budget with a net decrease of \$903. Budget for last fiscal year was based on a defecit of \$55,700 in an effort to return value to player families after running consecutive excesses in revent years.

Notable items and differences between FYE 2024 Budget and FYE 2024 Actuals are as follows:

<u>Registration - \$49,191 Higher Than Budgeted</u> - Players registration increased to 915 from previous season and historical registration numbers which have remained around the 800 player figure.

<u>Referee Fees - \$14,733 Higher Than Budgeted - Referee fees increased in FY2024 due to higher number of games resulting from higher than anticipated registration.</u>

<u>Ice Rentals - \$23,040 Higher Than Budgeted</u> - Ice rental rates increased due to shortages of municipal ice and increased utilization of higher cost private ice facilities.

The budget for this forthcoming season dictates that the registration fees remain unchanged from FYE2022. Rationale for the decision is based on the following:

- BMHA has endeavored to return value to player families by running budget defecits to utilize excess cash and will continue to do so in FY2025
- Player registrations have increased and BMHA anticipates registration in line with FY2024.
- BMHA has adequate liquidity for immediate needs and has no plans to build further budget contingencies.

I was appointed to this position halfway into the season after the November board meeting and would like to thank the executive committee for welcoming me and allowing me to be a part of this group.

Thank you to all coaches, off ice official and volunteers that helped make this past season a success to allow the players at BMHA an opportunity to play hockey.

All reimbursements that have been submitted by coaches for their clinics have been sent out. If you have not submitted your receipts, please complete the form on the BMHA website to receive your reimbursements for the coaching clinics.

For any coaches that have not submitted their workbooks, please do so as soon as possible to get you verified for next season.

Thank you to the development team for their hard work and dedication this past year to provide development to our young hockey players. This past season was difficult with ice availability issues and not everyone received as much development as they wanted. Goalie development was provided this past season by Pro-formance Goalie Schools and was well received.

The focus for the upcoming season will be to increase the frequency and availability of development for all groups U13 and below and continue with goalie development.

The Development Committee has recently developed an RFP with multiple groups making submissions. This committee will make recommendations to the new board to make a final decision on which group(s) will be brought on to provide development to BMHA for the 2024/25 season.

Director of Growth Report June 2024

The 2023/24 season saw both tremendous results along with some very unique challenges for the Growth portfolio. From a results standpoint, the Association saw strong growth in all components which contributed to the increase in overall membership we saw this year. This was against the backdrop of the restricted available ice we all dealt this season, as well as the restructuring of the U7 and U9 programs.

U5

While we did not actively market our U5 program this past season due to the lack of available ice, we did have a great program for our 4-year-olds who started their hockey journey this past season. They shared ice times with the U7 program, and in some cases, even practiced and played with the older players without missing a beat! Special thanks to Tony Vuong who helped make the season a success for these families.

U7

In the summer of 2023, our governing body, PCAHA, reformatted the younger age groups, combining the U6 and U7 ages into one age group, with the idea of teaming players by skill level rather than birth year. While this concept of U7 Major and U7 Minor was new to us, kudos to all who helped make this work on the fly as both we and PCAHA learned throughout the season of the effects of this new system. We had 2 U7 Minor Teams and 1 U7 Major Team, and all three teams were fully rostered with registration capped by September. All 3 teams had first time Team Managers, and they and the coaches did a spectacular job. This is the first time in many years that 5-year-olds were actually able to play games against other teams outside of the jamboree format as well as enter U7 tournaments.

<u>U9</u>

The U9's also were reformatted into the Major/Minor setup, and this division was one where the growth of the Association was very obvious. We had 2 U9 Major Teams and 4 U9 Minor Teams, and every single team reached the maximum roster size by the time the season started. All 6 teams had full compliments of rostered officials who put in many hours to make this season a success. With the grouping of 7 year olds and 8 year olds into one division, it also meant that 7 year olds were exposed to full-ice game play for the first time in many years. We were also able to see the emergence of some players who gravitated to the goaltender position, which will serve the association well in the years to come, rather than having to wait until the U11 age group for full-time goalies to emerge. We look forward to watching this cohort continue to develop in BMHA as we saw really strong game play develop in all 6 teams through the inter-Association games and the many tournaments they were able to play in. Special thanks to Milan Ringler, the Division Manager who had twice the number of teams to coordinate in this combined age group than DM's in prior years had.

In addition to the many parent volunteers across these 3 divisions, special thanks to our development team of Lance Bourne and Travis Deaust, who were tasked with helping to organize the Minor/Major split in both U7 and U9, coordinate player assessments, help to develop our parent coaches in these age

groups, all while dealing with the scarce ice availability that the delay of the new rinks and closure of Kensington brought to us.

With the opening of Rosemary Brown Recreation Centre after the season was done, we were able offer an abbreviated Pond Hockey program for both the U7 and U9 ages and get our players on the ice in the spring ... well after the ice was out of the arenas in previous years. This was a great success, and these 5 week sessions showcased the strong demand for BMHA programming in the spring should the City agree in future years to keep ice available in at least one rink rather than the past when it all came out in April.

MicroHockey

Our Microhockey program also saw growth this year, with a large influx of First Shift graduates, particularly in the second half of the season. Mel Madrazzo organized volunteers, including several Youth Mentors from our Association to provide both development and fun, stress free game play for our members, with the demand for this program continuing to grow. Off-season inquiries for MicroHockey for the coming season are at an all-time high, and we look forward to this continuing this program which provides accessibility to hockey for families that aren't ready or able to commit to the full time association team programs.

Bauer NHL/NHLPA First Shift

This past season, BMHA was able to host our usual Fall and Winter First Shift cohorts, and also had a pilot program with Canlan at ScotiaBarn to host a 2nd Winter cohort on a trial basis. Through these 3 cohorts, we had approximately 100 new to hockey players participate, with many of the Fall cohort transitioning to Microhockey in January. It was not unusual on Sunday mornings at Burnaby Lake Arena while the First Shift sessions were running to bump into Vancouver Canucks alumni such as Kirk Mclean, Jyrki Lumme and Dave Babych join our players on the ice, along with SFU Hockey players every week. We even had a guest appearance of Canucks mascot Fin which was definitely a highlight for the kids! Dave Graves and Edwin Wang returned as lead instructors, and we had over a dozen other volunteers and Youth Mentors on the ice over the course of the season ... the success of which is due primarily to these on-ice volunteers.

We can't thank enough the dozens of rostered volunteer officials, the parent involvement, and the Youth Mentors who all contributed to the success of the growth programs across BMHA. In the coming season, with the new rinks on stream and more experience with the Major/Minor system in the U7 and U9 age group, we look forward to an even more successful season in 2024/25.



2023-2024 BMHA Referee In Chief Annual Report

The past season for officials was another very successful season. Overall, recruitment was up, retention was high and overall involvement by all the officials was fantastic.

The Referee In Chief has the duty to recruit and train new officials from the association. This past season saw 20 officials certify through the BC Hockey, Level 1 clinic hosted by BMHA. Though this number was a little lower than past seasons, other officials also certified through alternate avenues, (BC Hockey camps, Female Jamboree and other association clinics) which added another 15 new officials into the officiating pool. Overall, Burnaby had great numbers for returning officials. The net result was 103 youth officials registered in HorizonWebRef.

BMHA also has a great proportion of female officials, of which there are currently 31 officials. The officiating group also benefited from many adult officials that helped step in and assist when a game could not get filled. There are 10 adult officials/dads that regularly come to the aid. Thank you!

One of BC Hockey's key focuses this past season was on referee abuse. Rulebook section 11, maltreatment was one of the key points this season. There were very few reports submitted by the officials (U13 and below) and I would like thank the coaches and parents who treated the officials with respect! Patience and restraint is much appreciated as officials navigate the world of rules and decision making and the environment is getting much better!

In the busy season, there were 588 games assigned through HorizonWebRef. (a combination of Bulldogs, Wildcats and BWC). The total number of assignments was 1581. The total games for each division were as follows.

U7 =6 U9 = 99 U9 full ice = 30 U11 C = 76 U11 A = 105 U13 C = 132 U13 A = 140

With this many games and officials, training and development would be impossible without committed Mentors. This season had a fantastic group of mentors. Logan Uy, Summer Uy, James Cooper, Russell Mah and Evan Singer spent hours and hours at the rink guiding officials and helping with development. My sincere thanks and gratitude to everyone's extra efforts!

Annual General Meeting – June 19, 2024

We made it through the 2023-2024 season without the Kensington arena and the delayed opening of the Rosemary Brown Recreation Centre 2 arenas. By far, this was the most challenging season for ice allocation!

I would like to thank all the divisional managers, team managers and coaches for their patience and understanding on the limited ice availability. I would also like to thank the BMHA Executives for their support with this abnormal season with the limited ice.

BMHA started with the pre-season camps, High Performance, Hitting Clinics and goalie sessions. The U11 pre-evaluation and the rep tryouts took place with scrimmages on the weekend and continued into the following week. The Rust Removal camps took place in the last week of August.

All the Bulldogs and Wildcats teams were on their regular season ice schedule on Monday, September 25.

The rescheduling of conflict games begins when PCAHA games are posted throughout the season, from placement games, regular season games and playoff games. Early return of unusable game or practice ice is greatly appreciated as these ice returns will assist in rescheduling games efficiently.

The City of Burnaby secured ice at Scotia Barn Rink 6 and Rink 8 to compensate for the loss of Kensington arena starting October 2023. A few ice times were booked at other nearby arenas to alleviate the ice shortage.

GOALTENDER EQUIPMENT MANAGER REPORT

The objective of BMHA's goalie gear inventory is two-fold:

-To provide the equipment needed for kids at any age who want to try being a goalie.

-To provide backup goalie gear for BMHA teams.

We supply to all age groups from U7 to U18, with a focus on the younger levels.

Our inventory consists mostly of leg pads, chest protectors, gloves, blockers, and sticks. The notion being that kids at the younger levels, U7, U9, and U11 can utilize their own skates, pants, and caged helmets.

We have started to expand the range of our gear to pants, knee pads, and helmets for the older groups, where extra and specialized protection is becoming necessary.

This year we introduced the Goalie Gear Purchase Program, which allowed parents the opportunity to sell to BMHA any used, or outgrown equipment. This gives BMHA greater value for upgraded equipment, and parents a chance to recoup some of the costs of the most expensive position in sports.

We supply backup goalie gear to most of the U7-13 teams that request it, so please inquire with your coach or manager about borrowing the gear if your child is interested in trying out being in goal.

I also personally would love any feedback or suggestions with anything in regards to the goalie gear.
